## Burlington Historical Society Small Works Art Exhibition and Fundraiser Sale 2021

### *Sale Dates:*

A wine and cheese reception hosted by the BHS at the Elton Tavern. Attendees will have first opportunity to purchase from the collection of artwork which can be picked up after the exhibition on Tavern Day at 4pm. Tickets \$15pp at the door cash or check only. Artists attend for free.

### *Directions to Artists:*

1. Overall dimensions – no larger than 16' X16'. Enter one or more original paintings, drawings, photography, collage, mixed media, or design. You may submit up to 5 pieces. If desired, bring an artist statement to display with your work.
2. Each artist must complete the registration form with your name, mailing address, email address and phone. Your check for sold works will be mailed to that address. The registration form must be mailed or emailed by Sept 4 to Ann Jurkiewicz 48 Miller Road, Burlington, CT 06013 or [AnnLDJ@comcast.net](mailto:AnnLDJ@comcast.net). This makes set-up much easier. You do not need to list the art you will sell on the registration form but you will need to submit a list when you bring your works on Sept 12 for hanging.
3. All work must have an attached tag, FILLED in with your name and name of work.
4. Terms: all works will be sold for \$100 firm with 70% going to the artist and 30% going to the BHS.
5. Artwork must be prepared for hanging and brought to the Elton Tavern, 781 George Washington Turnpike, Burlington on Sunday, Sept. 12 from 4-6pm. Or arrange to drop off at Ann's house at 48 Miller Road, Burlington by calling 860-810-3938.
